Growing Green at Shree Mahalaxmi School



Aliza Kandel, initially mistook the "Eco-Club" for an economics association. "Before joining the eco-club, I didn't know about the Eco-club," she shared. "When our focal teacher introduced Eco-Club in School I thought Eco-club was related to Economics." However, an orientation from the National Society for Earthquake Technology (NSET) quickly clarified its true purpose. "After getting orientation from NSET, I finally know what Eco-Club really is and what it does," Aliza explained.

The Eco-Club, which just started this year, wasted no time getting to work. Their first initiative involved collecting Rs. 5 from each student from classes 4 to 10. With these funds, they purchased flower pots for every classroom, compensating for the school's limited gardening space. "We planted flowers in each pot and held an exhibition," Aliza proudly stated.

Following NSET training on plastic waste reduction, the club also implemented a waste management system in the school, utilizing segregation bins provided for proper disposal. Aliza and her team also actively participated in a meeting with the Mahalaxmi Municipality, contributing ideas for a successful Placard Campaign that were later implemented.
