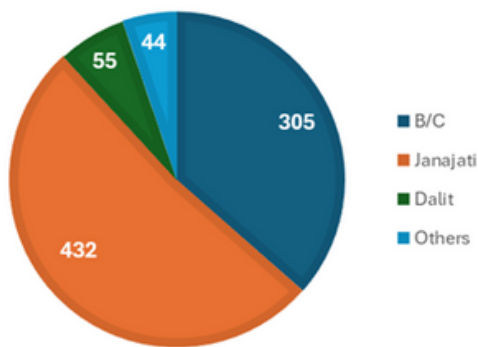


>>> DUSTBIN AND COMPOST BIN SUPPORT TO SCHOOLS

The campaign identified a lack of composting and waste segregation facilities in schools. To address this, each school was provided with a set of three color-coded dustbins (green, blue, and red) for proper waste segregation. In addition, one compost bin was supplied to every school to encourage composting and improve overall waste management practices.

The participants represented diverse ethnic groups, including 305 Brahmin/Chhetri, 432 Janajati, 55 Dalit and 44 from Other Ethnic groups

>>> PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS AND IMPACT

The campaign was successfully conducted in 47 schools across four municipalities: Mahalaxmi, Kirtipur, Changunarayan, and Lalitpur. A total of 839 students (364 male and 475 female) actively engaged in the activities. Students led presentations and activities focused on the 3Rs: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle. Hands-on sessions such as waste collection and weighing reinforced their learning. Overall, the campaign significantly promoted environmental awareness and sustainable practices in schools.
